ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT ORDINANCE

The City Council will consider the updated Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Ordinance on August 14th, at the regularly scheduled Council Meeting. This Ordinance revises sections of the Zoning Code based primarily on changes in State law, which increased allowable ADU heights and location in setbacks.

PUBLIC HEARING POSTCARDS

The Planning Division will now be mailing public hearing notification postcards, replacing letter notifications. The postcards will contain the same information, but will produce less waste and decrease the staff time needed to execute mailings. We welcome any feedback on the change. OCFA Best and Bravest, Part 4



OCFA Best and Bravest, Part 4 - On Saturday, June 4th, 2022, at around 10pm, the crew from Truck 75 in Santa Ana were dispatched to an “Unknown Medical Aid,” where neighbors described a man asleep in his idling car for an extended period. When the crew got on scene, they went to work: Firefighter/Paramedic Stacy was the radio medic, documenting everything about the patient; Fire Captain/Paramedic Richardson was the patient medic – taking vitals, asking questions, and working with Firefighter Lima, who was studying to be a paramedic. The job of Fire Apparatus Engineer Jason Rolston is scene safety, which includes parking the truck safely, lighting the scene, and overall situational awareness. Little did Engineer Rolston know how important his job would be on what started out as a routine medical aid call. As the crew checked out the patient, they noticed he was fiddling with something in his pocket and asked if he could empty his pockets. At that point, the patient stood up from the curb, continued fiddling with his pockets, said it was just his cell phone and started gaining distance from the crew. Engineer Rolston was walking around the car to clear it and noticed the patient backing up and saw him start to pull a gun out of his pocket. Without hesitation, Engineer Rolston lunged at the patient, grabbed his arm, and knocked the gun out of his hand. The crew didn’t realize what had happened until they saw the gun on the ground. The crew detained the patient until the police arrived. The patient was high on drugs, unreliable, lying about what was in his pockets, backing up from the crew, and pulling a loaded gun out of his pocket when Engineer Rolston sprang into action. If not for his selfless actions, there could have been four firefighter deaths in this incident. It’s for these heroic acts that Engineer Jason Rolston is awarded the Medal of Valor.
