


IN REMEMBERANCE OF PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR STEVE MYRTER

Steve Myrter retired from the City of Seal Beach after nearly thirty years of public service in September, 2022. Prior to being appointed as the Seal Beach Public Works Director in 2017, Steve proudly served the cities of Signal Hill, San Anselmo, Newport Beach, and Paramount. Steve selflessly devoted himself as a leader and a motivator



in Seal Beach. While an expert in many disciplines, Steve was always known as the "water guy". One would frequently find him working alongside the operations staff and be one of the first onsite to troubleshoot issues. He worked tirelessly to stabilize the water and wastewater rates so the City may continue investing in its infrastructure and address maintenance needs. Steve also worked closely with the regulatory boards to make sure we stay in compliance. Steve's presence will always be known here in Seal Beach.

SEAL BEACH PIER FIRE DRILL

OCFA Battalion Chief Mahon coordinated a drill at the Seal Beach pier on April 6th. The purpose of the drill was a simulated pier fire exercise using

standpipe, extended pier hoselay, and water rescue focusing on interagency communications and organization. Participating agencies included Orange County Fire Authority, Huntington Beach Fire Department, Long Beach Fire Department, the Naval

Weapons Station, Seal Beach Lifeguards and Seal Beach Police.

COMMUNITY SERVICES

- Staff began production of the Summer 2023 Shoreline covering the dates of June 12 August 26. Short-term rental lottery applications are now available on the City's website. The simple application can be quickly filled out and emailed str@sealbeachca.gov by May 5th, 2023 to express interest in obtaining one of the available short-term rental permits that will be offered by the City. May 10, 2023, all applications will be drawn in lottery style, creating a priority order for available permits. Short-term rentals must be located in the Coastal Zone (south of Westminster Boulevard) and may not be in a community that otherwise prohibits short-term rentals through private regulations such as CC&Rs. SEAL BEACH TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL CENTER

On the second of week of April, the Seal Beach Pickleball Association will begin several pickleball leagues at the Seal Beach Tennis and Pickleball Center. STRATEGIC PLANNING WORKSHOP

The Strategic Planning Workshop took place on Tuesday, April 4th at Fire Station 48. The City Council and Executive Team met with Baker Tilly's Special Advisor, Rick Haydon, and Managing Director, Carol Jacobs, to review key accomplishments and challenges the City has been faced with, and discussed and established top Council priorities for Fiscal Year 2023 - 2024. ANNUAL WINTER SAND BERM REMOVAL

The annual winter sand berm is scheduled to be removed for the summer season. The project will begin on April 3rd, which is slightly later than past years due to an overabundance of caution for the recent storm and atmospheric rivers California has experienced recently. The removal of the sand berm typically takes about three weeks to complete and should be completed before the end of April. As always, please exercise caution and do not use the beach on the south side of the pier while heavy machinery is in use.

CITYWIDE SEWER LINE CLEANING

National Plant Services recently completed the cleaning and inspection of 165,200 feet City-owned sewer line. With the project completed staff will now be able to assess the CCTV inspection data and prioritize future sewer projects and repair work.

K-RAIL REMOVAL FROM ALMOND AVENUE

The Almond Avenue k-rails has been fully removed. These krails were initially installed to facilitate the 1-405 widening sound wall construction. The 1-405 contractor must still rebuild the curbing and plant new vines. Once the curbing has been rebuilt, parking will resume on both sides of Almond Avenue.

SEWER MANHOLE LID REPAIR

While performing routine sewer cleaning on Seal Beach Boulevard, staff discovered a severely deteriorated sewer manhole ring that inhibited its cover from properly setting. Staff worked with a contractor to repair the manhole quickly to prevent damage to the sewer and roadway infrastructure.

MAINTENANCE UPDATES

Maintenance staff worked diligently to fill in potholes throughout the City caused by the heavy rains and weather conditions. In addition, In efforts to enhance visibility around Bolsa Avenue at Silver Shoals intersection, staff installed additional advanced warning signage and striping to warn motorists of an upcoming crosswalk and be aware of pedestrians.

Last Sunday we held the last of our two tryouts. In total we had 50 people tryout, interviewed 26, and we invited 22 into our training academy. Overall this was a great turnout. The training academy consists of 4 weekends, Friday night, all day Saturday, and all day Sunday. The rookie academy is a competitive experience and not all the candidates will move on to become a Beach Lifeguard.

Sunday, April 2nd Lifeguards responded to a major medical aid in the San Gabriel River. A surfer riding a wave hit a sandbar and fell and hit his head. The injured surfer was packaged up on a backboard and sent to the hospital with neck pain. We were informed later that the surfer had fractured his C-1 vertebrae.

After weeks of cool weather and rain we have some warmer weather in the forecast. Next weekend we are expecting 80 degree temperatures. The warm weather coincides with the local school spring breaks, so we are increasing our staffing levels. Over the last couple of weeks we have received calls about kids riding e-bikes in the sand dunes near 3rd Street. We have been educating bike riders that bikes are not allowed on the beach.
