SHORT-TERM RENTAL LOTTERY

Short-term rental lottery applications are now available on the City's website. The simple application can be quickly filled out and emailed to str@sealbeachca.gov by May 5th, 2023 to express interest in obtaining one of the available short-term rental permits that will be offered by the City. On May 10, 2023, all applications will be drawn in lottery style, creating a priority order for available permits. Short-term rentals must be located in the Coastal Zone (south of Westminster Boulevard) and may not be in a community that otherwise prohibits short-term rentals through private regulations such as CC&Rs. PUBLIC WORKS UPDATES THROUGHOUT SEAL BEACH

10TH STREET BEACH PARKING LOT CLOSED

The 10th Street beach parking lot and the Pier will be closed to the public starting Monday, April 24th at 5 a.m. through Tuesday, April 25th at 5 p.m. for pier repair mobilization. The City's contractor, Jilk Heavy Construction, will be repairing the pier that was damaged by the Winter Storms.

STATE WATER SUPPLY UPDATE

After three of the driest years on record, heavy precipitation this winter has boosted California's snowpack to healthy levels and are helping replenish the State's depleted reservoirs and groundwater basins. Metropolitan Water District of Southern California recently published its Water Supply Conditions Report for April 2023. WATER DIVISION

Water staff attended an annual refresher training session on the safe practices and procedures for minimizing asbestos exposures from operations involving asbestos cement (AC) pipe. The training included information about the physical characteristics and health hazards of asbestos, types of AC pipe, safe practices when working with AC, and hands-on instruction on the proper use of tools and equipment while working with AC in the workplace.

SAND CLEAN UP

Staff removed all the sand on the 10th Street beach parking lot that piled up due to the high winds recently. Maintenance staff brought in a tractor and truck onto the parking lot and hand shoveled all the sand, and also brought in the City's mini sweeper to complete the work.

SAND BERM UPDATE

The sand berm removal continues to progress and is nearing completion. Over 23,000 cubic yards of sand have been knocked down and smoothed in preparation for the summer beach usage. The bulk of the work (rough grading) should be completed by Friday, April 21st. The work will be fully completed once the contractor has finished working with staff on smoothing the beach to its final summer elevations (final grading).
