COMMUNITY SERVICES

- There are currently 1.347 users registered for the Senior Transportation Program. The program is available for Seal Beach residents ages 60 years and older and consists of a pre-fixed shuttle route and Yellow Cab Taxi service. - There are currently 288 pickleball members and 86 tennis members at the Seal Beach Tennis and Pickleball Center. To sign up for a membership, please contact staff at the Center, or call (562) 598-8624 for more information.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Staff attended the Golden Rain Foundation Presidents' Council Meeting on July 6th to provide an update on the State's water supply conditions and current water use restrictions. Water supply condition updates and the most current water conservation measures can be found under the Water Conservation tab on www.sealbeachca.gov.
- MWDOC's leak detection crew has now surveyed close to 35 miles of the City's water distribution pipeline system. The assessment of Old Town and Leisure World has been completed. The final two areas of the survey, College Park West and College Park East, are anticipated to be completed by Friday, July 14th.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Animal Control Program began on July 1st and is progressing smoothly.
- Seal Beach Police Department Captains met with the Orange County District Attorney to discuss reporting requirements.
- They City's parking consultant facilitated a parking meeting with Mayor Moore to discuss parking data.
- Community Oriented Policing Team facilitated a Heron Pointe Town Hall meeting to discuss community safety strategies.
- Seal Beach Traffic Bureau hosted a traffic meeting in Leisure World on July 12th.

POP UP CITY HALL

On Friday, June 30th the City and Police Department hosted booths at the Leisure World Expo and had over 190 interactions with the public. The City Hall booth had information on senior transportation, water conservation, and senior card games, and the Police Department booth had information for scams and security safety. Mayor Tom Moore and Council Member Nathan Steele were in attendance and assisted with answering resident questions related to Leisure World and the City.


SENIOR CARD GAMES

ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY UPDATE



On July 7, 2023, at 9:31 pm, a 911 call was received stating a vehicle had crashed into a house in College Park West. Units responded and found a structure had been significantly damaged by a car that drove into the garage. One person was trapped. Additional firefighters from our Urban Search and Rescue team responded to stabilize the structure and assist with extricating the trapped victim. That victim was removed and transported with OCFA paramedics to a trauma center.

OCFA Best and Bravest, part three. On January 4, 2023, the crew of Engine 80 in the City of Garden Grove was dispatched to a dog bite. The crew on this day was Fire Captain Brizendine, Fire Apparatus Engineer Henshaw, Firefighter/Paramedic Cerami, and Firefighter Concialdi. They were met by a frantic person screaming to hurry on their arrival. They were told the victim was inside a bathroom with the dog that had bitten him numerous times. Captain Brizendine requested animal control and the police department for assistance. As they entered the residence, they were met with a large amount of blood on the walls and floor of the home. They were led to a door where the victim's brother was holding a door closed on the dog's body, preventing him from getting to the patient or out toward the firefighters. The dog was still very aggressive and threatening everyone near it. They could see the victim inside the bathroom. He was unconscious and was bleeding profusely from numerous significant and massive wounds. It was clear he needed immediate medical attention, and waiting for assistance from animal control would not be an option. Utilizing a pike pole meant for firefighting, Firefighter/Paramedic Cerami approached the dog that was still fighting to get loose and put himself in harm's way to secure the dog. Any wrong move within this small, confined area and the dog would have immediately attacked him. He successfully gained control of the dog, and Engineer Henshaw and Firefighter Concialdi entered the bathroom and pulled the victim out to safety. They immediately initiated bleeding control and began treating the victim. While enroute to the hospital, the victim went into cardiac arrest due to the extent of his injuries. With advanced life support treatment continued by Paramedics Brizendine and Cerami enroute and the actions of the trauma team at the hospital, the patient was revived and survived! If not for the immediate and courageous actions of the crew of Engine 80, this incident would have had a different outcome. For his brave actions taken in a clearly life-threatening situation, we honor Firefighter/Paramedic Cerami with a Medal of Courage. And for the coordinated work of Engine 80 in their successful effort to save a life in a dynamic and volatile environment, the crew of Engine 80 was recognized with a Unit Citation.




ALMOND AVENUE UPDATES


FRONTIER LINES AT TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL **CENTER**

The work included one new wooden pole which is almost complete. New fiber cable will be pulled through the conduits once the installation is completed.



ORANGE COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT WORK ALONG SFAL BEACH BLVD.

Work continues for Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) along Seal Beach Blvd. and Old Ranch Parkway. Due to traffic congestion constraints during the daytime work hours, most of the work is taking place starting at 6:00 pm — after peak afternoon traffic — and continuing through the night. OC San has been rehabilitating manholes and relining their sewer lines, which serve all Seal Beach residents. Most recently, OC San has been excavating and placing shoring for a new manhole just south of St. Cloud that will be up to 25 feet deep and more than 6 feet in diameter.
