- At the Regular City Council Meeting of June 12, 2023, Mayor and Members of the City Council recognized former Public Works Executive Assistant Elizabeth Camarena for more than 15 years of dedicated service to the City of Seal Beach.
- City Council also recognized Marine Safety Lieutenant Chris Pierce on his well deserved retirement after 33 years of dedicated service to the City of Seal Beach.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

MARINE SAFETY

- Sunday, June 11th was the first day of full deployment for the Marine Safety Department. All of our tower and unit positions will be staffed every day through Labor Day weekend.
- This week is our last week of training for both our beach and pool guards. All guards will be taught CPR, AED, oxygen, and first aid.
- Junior Lifeguards and swim lessons start next week.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- COP Team assigned to Beach Patrol has started.

- Commercial Traffic Enforcement took place in Seal Beach resulting in over 60 moving violations and 10 commercial vehicles being towed.

 Prevention Device Tester by the

 Environmental Health. To become a
 tester, one must go through extensive
 training, along with a written
 examination and field test. Backflow
 testing is crucial to ensure there is no
 untreated and/or contaminated water
 to goes into the potable water system.

- The City's annual M2 Eligibility package was approved at the June 12th City Council meeting. This submittal is required to be submitted to OCTA by June 30th of every year. M2 Eligibility will allow the City to be eligible for M2 funding, such as the Local Fair Share and competitive CTFP grant funding. With the approval of the City's eligibility package by City Council, staff will be submitting to OCTA by the required deadline of June 30, 2023.

ORANGE COUNTY FIRE AUTHORITY UPDATES



OCFA Bravest. and Sunday, December 11th, 2022, OCFA's Emergency Command Center received a 9-1-1 call of a reported victim trapped in the Santa Ana River channel and immediately dispatched a full swift water rescue response from Division 1. Part of that response is placing fire engines on bridges downstream in the event that the victim gets carried away in the fast-moving flood waters. While Engine 86 was sent to Garden Grove Boulevard, they were alerted to a second victim trapped in the waterway, directly below them, trapped against a bridge abutment. This second victim was cold, tired, surrounded by fast-moving water, and just 75 feet upstream from a dangerous low-head dam. Time was of the essence. Engine 86 initiated action and immediately called for additional resources, including Heavy Rescue 6 from Irvine and Technical Rescue Truck 61 from Buena Park.



While the additional resources were on their way, Engine 86 crew members Fire Captain Paramedic Jose Perez, Fire Apparatus Engineer Andrew Strebel, Firefighter Paramedic Jason Cella, and Firefighter Cesar Esmerio lowered down a life vest and rope to the victim to give him the best chance at survival.

Heavy Rescue 6 from Irvine, consisting of Fire Captain Chris Stevens, Engineer Joel Caro, Firefighter Shane Frederick, and Firefighter Anthony Pappani, arrived and assessed the situation. They worked with Truck 61, consisting of Fire Captain Jorge Robledo, Fire Apparatus Engineer Mike LeBeauf, Firefighter Sean Kelly, and Firefighter Erik Lamb. Together, they created a high point rescue, where the aerial ladder extends over a trench or bridge, and a rescue firefighter is lowered down into the channel to affect a rescue.

Firefighter Pappani was lowered into the channel, secured the victim into his harness, and the two were hauled out successfully. The victim was treated for hypothermia and transported to the local hospital.

CITY-WIDE LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

In anticipation of an agreement expiration, the City issued a Request for Proposals soliciting for City-Wide Landscape Maintenance Services. There was considerable interest, which provides for a more competitive pricing environment. A review panel has been established to review the proposals and interview the interested parties. A recommendation to City Council for award will be forthcoming.

SEAL BEACH PIER REOPENS

The Seal Beach Pier sustained considerable damage during this year's winter storms. An emergency declaration was made to repair the Pier to a structural sound state. The City retained Jilk Heavy Construction to reinstall the pilings, bracings, boat ramps, and other appurtenances immediately thereafter. The Pier, in its entirety, is now open to the public for use.

SEAL BEACH BOULEVARD SINKHOLE

On Friday, June 9, 2023, City staff was informed of an approximately 6-inch-deep sinkhole along Seal Beach Boulevard at Town Center Drive. City's contractor dispatched a crew and was able to assess the situation and secure the area. Final paving of the area is tentatively scheduled for the week of June 19th.



Orange County Sanitation District (OCSD) recently repaved sections of the bike lane along Westminster Avenue that had become damaged during OCSD's sewer construction project. Striping for the bike lanes will occur at night in the next few weeks. OCSD's overall project is nearing completion.
