PUBLIC WORKS

This year's construction of the winter sand berm is now complete. The project took roughly four weeks and included back-passing roughly 20,000 cubic yards of sand from west beach to east beach. Back-passing is performed biannually to help manage erosion along the east beach by recycling sand that naturally shifts northwestwards to west beach. The berm will remain in place until early spring, depending on the weather.

- Captain Nicholas recently engaged in discussions with parking vendors to streamline citation processing. Additionally, he met with a representative from the City of Dana Point's planning department to discuss matters concerning coastal parking, showcasing a commitment to addressing community needs and concerns.

Staff estimates roughly 2,000 people were in attendance during the event.



Public Works Updates

ANNUAL SLURRY SEAL PROJECT

The City's annual slurry seal project is underway and close to completion. This year, the City applied slurry seal to almost two miles of roadway located throughout College Park West and College Park East. Minor repair work and final striping is scheduled to be completed in late December.

REPLACING FALLEN TREES


