EDISON COMMUNITY GARDENS CLEAN UP AND SHED INSTALLATION

The quarterly community garden cleanup on August 12th at the Edison Park Community Gardens was a huge success. At the conclusion of the event, gardeners enjoyed a potluck lunch, sharing produce grown in their gardens and spending time together socially. Attending a minimum of one garden cleanup annually is mandatory for all gardeners to participate in the program. The last date for a Garden Clean will be on November 4th.



A new shed was installed at the Edison Community Gardens on Wednesday, August 9th. This shed will be used to store communal tools and items that will be available for all gardeners to use. New shovels, rakes, hoes, and other communal tools were also purchased for the gardeners. Funding for the new shed and tools were provided by a grant from Run Seal Beach, and Mayor Tom Moore's discretionary fund.

Public Works Updates Throughout Seal Beach

TROPICAL STORM HILARY

In close coordination with the O.C. Fire Authority, Police and Marine Safety Departments, Public Works crews were hard at work preparing for the arrival of Tropical Storm Hilary, including building temporary sand berms at the beach parking lots, checking and clearing storm drain systems, deploying portable storm pumps, and providing residents with sandbags to protect their homes. While ocean tides compounded with surf were within tolerance as the storm hit on Sunday, the City was still faced with a substantial amount of rain and high winds throughout the day and night. Public Works staffed the City to provide immediate response to any drainage and storm-related concerns. While no severe damage has been reported at this time, substantial debris removal and post-storm clean-up is underway.

MARINE SAFETY UPDATES

- The tropical storm made for an interesting day of lifeguarding. Lifeguards were stationed in their towers, units, and boat during the event. The rain did not discourage people from entering the water and because of the swell direction, Seal Beach had desirable wave conditions. Surfers came out by the hundreds and there was a particularly strong rip current and tidal flow in the San Gabriel River mouth. Our rescue boat, rescue watercraft, and tower lifeguards kept busy as surfers were getting pulled out past the harbor entrance, with some unable to return to shore. Lifeguards on the boat were quickly able to rescue those in distress, and hand them off to a tower guard who would safely navigate them back through the surf to the beach. During the two-day event, lifeguards performed the following:
 - 21 Rescues
 - 21 Preventative Actions
 - 12 Enforcements
 - 10 Medical Aids
 - 2 Major Medical Aids resulting in paramedic evaluation and further treatment
- On August 12th, Marine Safety Officer Jeremy Jenks responded to a night call about a 36' Sea Ray in the surf line. The boat was aground on Surfside Beach and the owner was not onboard. Lifeguards determined that the vessel was not able to be pulled offshore which resulted in a salvage operation. The next day lifeguards assisted Boat Tow US, a salvage company, to safely remove the boat from the beach.
- Midweek crowds have begun to wind-down with some schools returning. Full deployment of lifeguard staff will continue through Monday, September 4th, Labor Day weekend.

Identify your risks and have multiple barriers in place to keep children and adults safe from all water sources. Barriers buy time and offer protection if they are installed correctly and are in good working condition. The more barriers you install and maintain, the safer your family will be.



provides 100% protection. Multiple barriers must be in place so that if one fails, there is another to slow or prevent a child from reaching the water alone and unsupervised.

Non-Climbable Fences

- Install a 4-sided isolation fence tall enough (4-5 feet) to prevent children from climbing over.
- Make sure the bottom of the fence is close enough to the ground to prevent a child from crawling under.
- Ensure patio furniture is kept away from the fence so a child cannot use the items to climb.

Self-Closing or Latching Gates

- Install a self-closing or self-latching gate with a locking mechanism.
- Gates should be installed so that they open outward, away from the pool.
- Regularly inspect gates for damages to ensure a child's safety.

Pool and Spa Covers

- Purchase and use a pool and spa cover to protect children and pets.
- Covers for the pool and spa act as a horizontal fence should children or pets get near the water.

Alarms

- Having alarms on your doors, windows, and on the pool is important in case a child or pet comes in contact with water unexpectedly.
- Child wristband alarms and pet collars are available to purchase for additional protection. The base alarms are triggered as soon as the child or pet gets them wet, alarming others in the area.
- Purchase and use portable alarms that can be used at any pool, residential or community.

Indoor Barriers

 A child can drown in less than two inches of water. Purchase and install indoor barriers such as toilet latches, baby gates, and child-safe doorknob handle covers to ensure children cannot get into any rooms where water can be accessed.
