CITY MANAGER

- Awarded over \$33,000 in funds for the SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program.
- City received non-profit status from the IRS for the Seal Beach Historic Resources Foundation and secured a \$10,000 funding allocation from Council.
- Staff participated in a Centenarian Birthday Celebration in Leisure World hosted by the
 Golden Age Foundation with the support of Council Members Massa-Lavitt and Moore.
- City staff met with Frontier representatives to discuss new fiber optic cabling in CPE and CPW. A Council study session regarding this potential project was held on June 13th.
- Staff attended a Proposition 218 virtual collaboration meeting with the cities of Anaheim, Brea, Huntington Beach, and Placentia to discuss ways in which different cities observe the Prop 218 process.
- City staff along with SBTV-3 reps attended a
 Council Chamber technology tour hosted by
 the City of Simi Valley. Simi Valley staff and
 their contractor were on hand to showcase
 their new audio/visual equipment, as well as
 describe how they have met the challenges of
 the new virtual environment. Many other
 cities were also present and discussed a
 myriad of challenges they've faced with Zoom,
 Teams, and WebEx platforms.
- The City co-hosted the Summer Concert Series with the Seal Beach Chamber of Commerce.
- The City participated in the Leisure World Health Fair.

- Approved a contract for service with Transtech Engineers for FY 22-23 to provide comprehensive Building Division services.
- Approved a contract for service with Sagecrest Planning and Environmental to provide interim Planning staff due to staff vacancy.
- Joined the Orange County Housing Finance Trust.
- Approved a contract with Psomas to prepare an Environmental Impact Report for a proposed project at the Old Ranch Golf Course.
- Approved a Zone Text Amendment in the RLD-9 "Gold Coast" zoning district.

PUBLIC WORKS

- Published its 2022 Water Quality Report, which includes information on where the City's water comes from, how it is tested, what is in it and how it compares with state and federal limits.
- Staff contacted the Orange County Health Care Agency (OCHCA) to respond to and investigate recent illegal dumping that has taken place on City property.
- Water Division began importing water through our Metropolitan Water District (MWD) connection making up the balance of the City's water supply in addition to groundwater pumping.
- Water Division began public outreach to residents and customers of the recently declared Level 2 water supply shortage at the July 25th Council public hearing.
- The Rivers & Mountains Conservancy organized a tour of the Los Cerritos Wetlands to discuss the envisioned restoration plan that would affect both the City of Long Beach and Seal Beach.
- Partnered with the California Joint Powers Insurance Authority (CJPIA) to pilot test a sidewalk assessment program.
- In celebration of National Water Quality Month in August, Public Works shared its water quality video produced in partnership with Orange County Water District (OCWD) to showcase how the City safeguards the City's water supply.
- On July 25th, Resolution 7314 was adopted to provide additional on-call plan checking support to assist with increased development review needs.
- On August 8th, Resolution 7323 was adopted to retain EXP US Services to design the Seal Beach Boulevard at North Gate Road pavement intersection utilizing one-time Pavement Management Relief Funding (PMRF) funds.
- On August 4th, Public Works issued a Notice Inviting Bids for the Beverly Manor Well Rehabilitation Project.
- Partnered with CJPIA to conduct safety training for our field staff, including confined space entry, bucket truck safety, and forklift operations training.

Staff hosted a community garden cleanup on Saturday, August 6th at the Edison Park Community Gardens. Attending a minimum of one garden cleanup annually is mandatory for all gardeners to participate in the program. Public Works staff repainted the crosswalks around McGaugh Elementary as well as all the red curbing.







COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRESS UPDATES

- Several projects of community interest are moving forward with the Planning process.
 - The applicant for the Chevron Station at 1300 PCH is working with staff to schedule a meeting of the Environmental Quality Control Board to review the Negative Declaration prepared for the project.
 - o The City has received a proposal for a Mitigated Negative Declaration as a part of the entitlement process for a solar project at Hellman Ranch. As with all CEQA projects, the City acts as the lead agency, but the project applicant pays for the work.
 - The City and applicant for the Old Ranch Country Club Specific Plan are collecting relevant information as a part of initial data gathering for the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for that project. After review of the proposed project, the City has determined enough information is available to perform a Project EIR.
 - The City has obtained a proposal for an Environmental Impact Report, which will analyze the Zoning Code Update the City is required to complete in order to facilitate implementation of the Housing Element. The estimated cost for the EIR is \$350,000-\$400,000.
- Staff is finalizing the revised Accessory Dwelling Unit Ordinance, pursuant to direction from the California Department of Housing and Community Development, and expects to present it to the Planning Commission in September and the City Council in October.
- A study session with the Planning Commission on the Zoning Code Update is tentatively scheduled for September 19th.
- In conjunction with Public Works, staff obtained cost estimates related to pre-fabricated parklets and is working on a programmatic approach to the future of the parklets that can be presented to the City Council.
- Code enforcement efforts continue on Main Street, with a number of improvements noted over the last month, including cleaner parklets and easier pedestrian travel along sidewalks. Sidewalk vendors are being checked for appropriate licenses and staff is working with sidewalk entertainers, considered a form of free speech, to ensure pedestrian access is not obstructed for safety purposes.

ANNUAL CONCRETE REPAIRS

The City's Public Works staff and a contractor began working on the City's annual concrete repairs throughout the city. The work consisted of repairing sidewalks and gutters and addressing areas that had lifted concrete. Public Works staff and the contractor interacted with residents and answered questions as crews were working in various areas of the

lifting sidewalk throughout various areas of the city. This past week, staff worked in Old Town and the Hill. Staff also oversaw work done by a paver contractor to overlay pavers to make way for a smooth walkway.





Staff worked alongside a welding contractor to fabricate and install a wrought iron security fence along the bike trail at the west end pump station. The contractor also fabricated and installed a new gate from the Eaves apartments' side of the station.
