

SEAL BEACH TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL CENTER REMODEL




•Work at the Seal Beach Tennis and Pickleball Center is ongoing. The construction crew has almost completed demolition of the club house interior.

- Captain Nicholas attended the California Mobility and Parking Association conference in San Jose, where he showcased his experience by taking an active role. His presentation and moderation of a panel on front-line parking enforcement contributed valuable insights to the conference attendees, fostering collaboration and knowledge-sharing among professionals in the field.
- Boeing Seal Beach requested Police Facility Dog Yosa to spend time at their facility highlights the recognition of the therapeutic and comforting role that animals, especially trained police facility dogs, can play in times of distress. This gesture not only showcases the collaboration between law enforcement and corporate entities, but also underscores the understanding of the positive impact that such interactions can have on the well-being of employees facing difficult circumstances.
- The closure of the Old Town parking survey on Nov. 17th emphasizes the urgency for residents, employees, visitors, and business owners to share their perspectives. This survey serves as a democratic tool, enabling diverse voices to contribute to decision-making processes and ensuring that parking solutions align with the needs and preferences of the community.
- The Community Oriented Policing Team attended the E-Bike Safety Summit with other coastal communities. The purpose of the summit is to review current laws, municipal codes, and towing authorities around the county to ensure all cities are on the same page when it comes to safely enforcing E-Bike regulations.
- Captain Ezroj will be attending the Orange County Traffic Safety Summit. This is part of the Office of Traffic and Safety Grant (OTS) to address and assist all cities with enforcement events. This one-day summit also allows departments to schedule and collaborate traffic enforcement activities.
- Lieutenant Clasby will attend the SWAT Quarterly Meeting with other SWAT Commanders around Orange County to discuss SWAT callouts, training procedures and legal updates. This information will then be passed down to the department staff who work on the SWAT Team to ensure everyone is up to date on legal matters.

WESTMINSTER DRAINAGE CHANNEL CLEAN-UP

This drainage channel discharges stormwaters from the southern portion of Leisure World to Los Alamitos Retarding Basin where it is then pumped into the San Gabriel River.

WEST END PUMP STATION HYDRORANGERS

Two new HydroRanger level monitors have been installed at West End Pump Station, in preparation for the upcoming storm season. The ultrasonic monitors provide the station controllers with real-time measurements of the basin water level. The controllers start up the storm pumps when the programmed set point is reached.



BIANNUAL CATCH BASIN CLEANING



The City's contractor, Ron's Maintenance, has removed all dirt, silt, trash, and other deposited pollutants from 220 City catch basins just in time for the first rain of the winter rainy season. You can help too! Please remember to pick up all trash and debris that may wash into storm drain inlets or gutters. Grass, leaves, and other yard wastes clog the drainage system and pollute our environment. Remember, all storm drains flow directly into the ocean.

Safety Marine Department RED RIBBON WEEK AT MCGAUGH ELEMENTARY

The Seal Beach Lifeguard Department is sending one of its own to New Zealand. Jackson Lawrence will represent our town as well as the Marine Safety Department as part of the California Surf Lifesaving Association (CSLSA) exchange program. Lawrence, who attended McGaugh and graduated from Los Alamitos High School, was selected from a pool of statewide candidates to participate in the program with New Zealand lifeguard departments. Lawrence and his partner, Vianne Kelly from LA City Lifeguards, will spend six weeks sharing lifesaving ideas, techniques and equipment with their Kiwi counterparts.

"I'm very honored to have been selected for this exchange," said Lawrence. "I've wanted to be a part of this program ever since I heard about it. It's exciting."

Starting in 1969, the program has allowed two lifeguards from each country to travel across the globe to promote and maintain a long-lasting camaraderie between associations. This past summer, lifeguards from New Zealand visited Southern California beaches, including Seal Beach. This is only the fourth time in its more than 50-year history that a Seal Beach Lifeguard has been selected.

"Lawrence will bring his lifeguarding skills and abilities learned in Seal Beach to collaborate with the Kiwis and apply them abroad. As a department, we look forward to hearing about his experiences and the knowledge he will bring back from this adventure," said Lt. Nick Bolin. "We are thrilled to have our own Seal Beach Lifeguard representing California Surf Lifesaving and the City of Seal Beach overseas."

Lawrence and Kelly will head to Auckland in December, staying with host families and experiencing the peak of the New Zealand summer.

A fundraiser will be held at O'Malley's on Main Street on Tuesday, November 21st at 6pm. A portion of the night's sales will be donated to the Seal Beach Lifeguard Association and the exchange program.
