

Keeping Seal Beach Clean & Safe





Community members have indicated it is a top priority to keep our community safe.

Unfortunately, despite the city's best efforts last year, there were over 700 thefts, burglaries, robberies, and auto thefts in the City of Seal Beach—the highest number in five years. The City must maintain public safety and community policing efforts to keep residents and their property safe.


Crime Statistics



- Crime overall for all categories down 4% for 2023 as compared to 2022
- Retail theft up 16%
- > 2023
 - > Arrests 809
 - Moving violations 3,416
 - > 9-1-1 Calls 1,468
 - ➤ Patrol Checks 7,688







Maintaining Emergency Services





Residents have indicated emergency medical services are a top priority. So far this year alone, approximately 75% of all calls to the Orange County Fire Authority that serves Seal Beach have been related to medical emergencies.

FY 2024-25 Five-Year Forecast




- > FY 2023-24 Projected \$1.7M Deficit/FY 2024-25 began with a \$6 million deficit.
 - ➤ Historically high inflation rates
 - > Increases in contract costs and mandates not within the City's control
 - ➤ Historical service levels
- Extensive review process involving over 30 rounds of revenue and expenditure analysis and reductions
- ➤ Included a 3rd City Council Workshop to further balance the Budget
- ➤ Salary and benefit costs were reduced by \$1 million
- Maintenance and operations budgets across the City were reduced by over \$3 million impacting service response times, upkeep, and quality of life
- ➤ Revenue projections were analyzed rigorously
- ➤ The five-year outlook incorporates balancing measures, unsustainable for the long-term
- ➤ Budget balanced with one-time asset forfeiture funds

What is Measure GG?





Measure GG is a local, ½ cent sales tax measure on your Municipal Election ballot.

The Seal Beach City Council unanimously placed Measure GG on the November 5, 2024 ballot to allow voters to consider generating additional funds for general City services and priorities identified by residents, such as medical emergency response, public safety, and keeping beaches and other public areas clean and safe.

Official Measure GG Ballot Question



City of Seal	Beach	Services	Measure
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Shall the measure funding City of Seal Beach general services such as maintaining 911 medical emergency/police/fire response, helping prevent property crimes/retail thefts; keeping public areas/beaches safe/clean; helping protect local water quality; reducing risk of flooding; retaining/supporting local businesses; addressing homelessness; repairing streets/potholes; by establishing a ½¢ sales tax providing approximately \$3,000,000 annually until ended by voters; requiring audits, public spending disclosure, all funds spent for Seal Beach, be adopted?

Who Pays for Measure GG?



Almost half of all sales tax dollars collected in Seal Beach are paid by tourists who visit our beaches, shop at local stores, and eat in our restaurants, as well as day visitors who work in Seal Beach.



Fiscal Accountability



Measure GG revenue is subject to strict accountability provisions, including citizen oversight with public disclosure of all spending, mandatory financial audits, and reports to the community.
